



Speed Limit Reduction near Tyee Middle School

Speed limit takes effect this summer

July 2022

Earlier this year, we let you know that the speed limit on most streets surrounding Tyee Middle School would be reduced from 25 mph to 20 mph. This speed limit reduction is in response to community concerns about high vehicle speeds. The reduced speed limit will create safer routes to school for children in the neighborhood, create a more comfortable environment for people walking and support the city's Vision Zero effort to eliminate serious injury and fatal collisions on city streets by 2030.

Existing speed limit signs will be changed to reflect the 20 mph speed limit. Additional speed limit signs will also be installed to reinforce the lower speed limit. **The installation is expected to begin as soon as August 1.** Please visit the project webpage for updated information on the installation timing and a map of streets that will have a 20 mph speed limit.

Safe streets are a shared responsibility. Please do your part, set an example and remember that "20 mph is plenty."
