What you need to know:
If you are the victim, a witness, or a
suspect in a crime, the Bellevue Police
will not ask you what your immigration
status is.







This rule also applies if you are stopped for a traffic violation. If you are stopped while driving, police will ask to see your drivers' license, vehicle registration, and insurance papers.

If you are arrested, the Officer may ask you what your country of citizenship is in order to provide you with an opportunity to speak with a consular representative from your country. They are NOT asking you this to deport you or to contact immigration authorities.

For suspects accused of felony crimes, we may contact immigration authorities to help us remove these individuals if they are a clear danger to the community. Again, we will never do this in case of a traffic violation or a minor crime.
