Thursday, April 7: “The Time Traveler's Wife” *The Time Traveler's Wife* stars Eric Bana and Rachel McAdams as Henry and Clare, who meet near the beginning of the film in an unusual fashion: He works in a Chicago research library and has a secret; she already knows his secret -- and has known him all her life, though he says he's never met her before. The long and short of it is that, as the title says, he's a time traveler by a genetic anomaly. Great movie.

Thursday, April 14: “How to Train Your Dragon” How to Train Your Dragon is funny, entertaining, and may be the best animated film Dreamworks has made to date. This award-winning film tells the story of skinny, quirky Hiccup a young Viking who befriends Toothless, a young dragon in order to save his reputation. He learns the danger of prejudice the value of friendship.

Thursday, April 21: “The Trip to Bountiful” This Academy Award-winning film, set in the 1940s, tells the story of Carrie Watts, an elderly woman who wants to return home to her small hometown but is repeatedly stopped from by her daughter-in-law and overprotective son who won't let her travel alone. Mrs. Watts is determined to outwit them both, and sets out. On the journey she makes friends in the most unlikely places, makes peace, and heals her heart.

Thursday April 28: “Dream Girls” Historical fiction set in the turbulent 1960s to mid-70s, "Dreamgirls" follows the rise of a trio of singers--Effie, Deena and Lorrell--who have formed a promising group called The Dreamettes. At a talent competition, they are discovered by an ambitious manager, who offers them the opportunity of a lifetime, which may come at too high a price.
