Housewife and mother Penny Chenery (Diane Lane) agrees to take over her ailing father's Virginia-based Meadow Stables, despite her lack of horse-racing knowledge. With the help of veteran trainer Lucien Laurin (John Malkovich), she successfully navigates the business, and fosters the first Triple Crown winner in 25 years and what may be one of the greatest racehorses of all time.

Thursday, July 14 "Appolo 13"

Based on the true story of the ill-fated 13th Apollo mission bound for the moon.
