# **Public Engagement—Survey**


Questions ask about perceptions of current conditions, priorities for funding:

- Opinion of conditions citywide regarding the following:
  - Traffic congestion
  - Sidewalks
  - Conditions for bicycling
  - Residents are also asked for their opinion of conditions in their neighborhood.
- Relative priority for use of Transportation funding:
   Construct sidewalks on arterials
  - ☐ Construct neighborhood sidewalks
  - ☐ Complete cross-town bike routes
  - ☐ Improve speed & reliability of transit
  - ☐ Add road capacity to serve growth
  - ☐ Add road capacity to relieve peak period congestion
  - Maintain existing facilities
- Question about whether changes in infrastructure or transit service would impact the respondent's choice of transportation modes.
