




How much has COVID-19 impacted your daily life?









What are you most concerned about?




Have you or a member of your household experienced reduced income due to COVID-19?




Do you have confidence in your household's ability to pay next month's housing costs?




How much has COVID-19 impacted your sense of community?

The department offers a wide range of services to residents.

The impacts from COVID-19 on each type of service have been very different.





Parks and Trails Usage

- Trail and park usage has significantly increased
- •The local trend is in line with the national trend: 3 in 5 people (more than 190 million people) visited a local park, trail, public open space or recreation facility during the first three months of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Parks and trails provide a physical and emotional health benefit





Facility Use

•Traditional services our department offers have been cancelled to slow the spread of COVID-19.

 Under the Stay Safe, Stay Home order, we have been able to safely reopen our Golf Course, Tennis Center, and Aquatics Facility for some limited services.

•Our staff have been incredibly nimble and have shifted to provide various forms of virtual programming.





Human Services

- •Drastic increase in the number of families experiencing financial, health, and emotional crisis.
- Disproportionate impacts on residents of color, with disabilities, and LGBTQ residents.
- •Our City response is nimble and continuing. To date, Council has made 3 additional allocations of human services dollars.
- Human Service Providers in the community have found creative ways to offer services.






