


Northwest
Bellevue:
NE 5th St/98th
Ave NE/NE 1st St

As part of the City of Bellevue's response to the COVID-19 crisis, the Transportation Department implemented a Bellevue Healthy Streets pilot project in the Lake Hills and Northeast Bellevue neighborhoods in early May.

This pilot project is being expanded to NE 5th St/98th Ave NE/NE 1st St, connecting to Meydenbauer Bay Park and Downtown Park along with other downtown destinations. These streets are being temporarily closed to non-local vehicle traffic to provide more room for people to move while socially distancing during COVID-19.



Local vehicle access for

residents and essential services will be maintained and on-street parking will continue.

The temporary street closure will be marked with signs and make it easier for people to bike, walk and roll for recreation and to reach essential services.

The street is expected to close between June 3-June 10 and will remain closed to non-local vehicle traffic pending further guidance on social distancing from the Governor's Office and public health officials, or as directed by the City of Bellevue.

I live on or near the street. Can I still drive my car on the closed streets to get home?

Yes. The streets will remain open for local motor vehicle traffic including residents, emergency response vehicles, garbage and recycling pickups, delivery drivers and access to the park via 98th Ave NE.

How long will the streets be closed?

The streets will remain closed to non-local vehicle traffic pending further guidance on social distancing from the Governor's Office and public health officials, or as directed by the City of Bellevue.

Why were these streets selected to be closed?

The streets were selected because they have relatively low traffic volumes, are near other streets that drivers can use to avoid long detours, are long enough to provide a good route for riding and walking, and are without sidewalks or connect to parks and commercial centers that provide needed services.

Is on-street parking impacted?

No. You can still park on the street.

Access to Meydenbauer Bay Park parking lot via 98th Ave NE will remain open.
