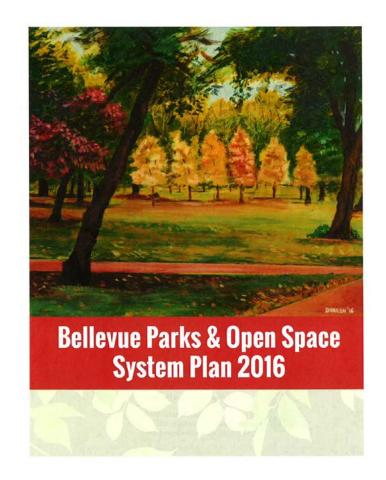

Introduction to Long Term Funding Needs

- Source: 2016 Park Plan organized by focus area
- Identified "most likely" projects over next 20 years (excl 2008 Levy)
- Cost estimates reflect "order of magnitude" impacts in today's dollars
- Project costs often shown as "range" due to uncertain elements
