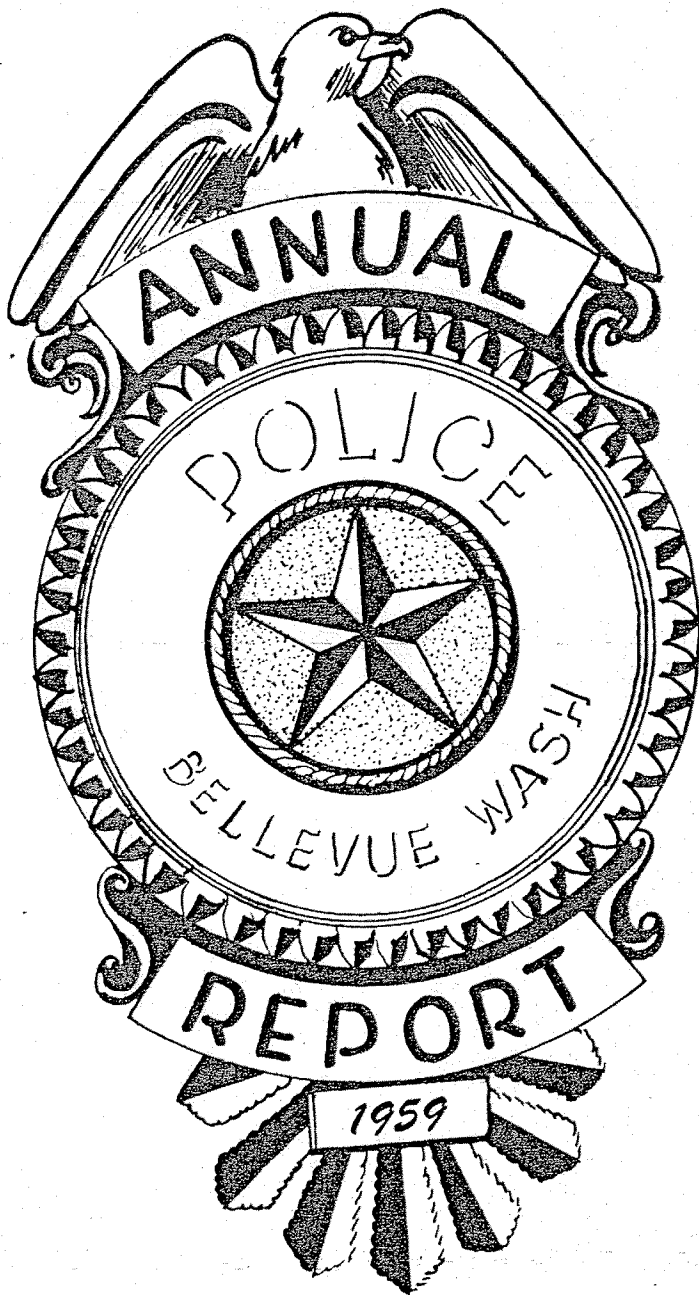

## POLICE DEPARTMENT VEHICLES

The department has a total of five pieces of motorized equipment consisting of three 1959 Ford Sedans, one 1957 Nash Ambassador Sedan and one 1955 Harley-Davidson Motorcycle.

The Nash Ambassador is used on a rental basis from the local Nash garage.

Likewise, one of the Fords is used on a rental basis from the Metke Ford Agency.

The city owns the remaining two Fords and the Motorcycle.

All units are fully equipped with emergency and other necessary police devices.
