EASTSIDE NARCOTICS TASK FORCE

SUMMARY OF ACITVITY FOR 1998

The Eastside Narcotics Task Force is comprised of five local Police agencies on the East side of King County, which contribute personnel and resources. These agencies include: Bellevue, Redmond, Kirkland, Mercer Island and Issaquah. The Task Force also includes a King County Deputy Prosecutor, a secretary and a National Guard Intelligence Officer. A Bellevue Police Department Captain commands the Task Force, and reports to the Chiefs of Police of the member Departments. A Bellevue Police Department Lieutenant supervises the detectives.

The Eastside Narcotics Task Force has the responsibility to investigate narcotic trafficking within its jurisdictional boundaries and/or within King County when the activity impacts the Task Force cities. The primary focus of the Task Force is to detect and arrest individuals and /or organizations involved in this trafficking, to aggressively pursue the source of narcotics and to make dealing drugs on the Eastside less profitable through incarceration and property forfeiture.

One major change occurred in 1998 that was of great benefit to the Task Force. In July, a reorganization took place that transformed this conglomeration of various Police agencies into a true Task Force, whereby all of the Departments partake in the expenses and seizures based upon a percentage basis, not by which individual detective has which case or tip. The biggest advantage to this arrangement is that the detectives readily share information and cases and there is never a question on whose case is most important at any particular time.

Several personnel changes took place during 1998, which included three new detectives coming on board: from KPD Gary Eggleston replaced Steve Oskierko, Mark Jordan replaced Mike Johnson from BPD and IPD's Scott Behrbaum took Jeff Johnson's position. Lt. Bill Bryant came to the end of his three-year term as the unit supervisor and was replaced in November by Lt. Jim Kowalczyk. Another important addition was of the four-legged variety. With the assistance of HIDTA funds, the Bellevue Police Dept. acquired a K9 Narcotics detection team. BPD Officer John Jesson and his new partner, K9 Dollar completed their training in the fall and are now beginning to make cases. The team is assigned to the Operations Division, but they maintain an office in the ENTF section and work closely with the detectives. Officer Jesson and K9 Dollar also assist with the Drug Interdiction program, working the eastside freeways.

This past year, the Task Force has seen an increase in Marijuana grow operations and the manufacture and sale of Methamphetamine. In 1998, there were 41 grow operations with 2957 plants and 17405 grams of processed marijuana seized (value: \$4,290,010.00) and \$87,920.00 worth of grow equipment. Also in 1998 three clandestine Meth labs were discovered and 1164 grams of meth confiscated (\$116,460.00), which was the largest quantity of this highly addictive drug ever seized in one year by the Task Force. Other seizures in 1998 include: 2744 grams of cocaine (\$274,480.00 value), 54.2 grams of

Rock cocaine (\$5,420.00), 51 grams of heroin (\$7,635.00) and 253 hits of LSD (\$1,265.00). Property and assets taken in were valued at \$808,923.85. The number of persons arrested went up nearly 15% (224 in 1998 compared to 195 in 1997), search warrants increased by 27% (85 in 1998 to 67 in 1997). Also, 35 vehicles and 60 guns were seized. Combining all drug and asset seizures for the year, the Task Force totaled \$5,505.377.85. Task Force personnel accumulated 1642 hours of training during the year.

SPECIFIC INVESTIGATIONS OF INTEREST

The Eastside Narcotics Task Force is involved in a wide variety of investigations and cases, which makes it difficult to select what would be considered the "best" of 1998. The following is merely a sampling of some of these more "interesting" cases:

January 23: Detectives from Winona, Minnesota relayed information to the Task Force regarding cash and documentation being sent from their area to Redmond. The suspects were living in a mobile home, and they had previously been arrested in Minnesota for growing marijuana. Investigative efforts yielded a search warrant for the mobile home, and when it was served a large scale growing operation was located. 132 mature marijuana plants were being grown inside the mobile home, and 105 plants were found in a second grow which was constructed inside the shop alongside the mobile home. ¹/₄ pound of processed marijuana ready to go was also confiscated. Two suspects were arrested.

February 5: An investigation into cocaine being sold out of the **Jade East** restaurant in Bellevue resulted in a major operation for the Task Force. The owner was involved and was actually selling cocaine while tending bar. A search warrant was obtained and the owner arrested with 68 bindles of cocaine in his possession. Another warrant was served on his residence and the suspect booked. He posted \$20,000.00 cash bail and released. Intelligence revealed that the owner was dealing cocaine from the restaurant while out on bail, and a subsequent warrant was served on the **Jade East** on February 10. The owner was arrested a second time, and agents from the Washington State Liquor Control Board assisted in posting an emergency suspension of the liquor license. More cocaine was seized, along with cash. Total seizures in this case: 114 grams of cocaine, 165 grams of marijuana, \$49,394.00 cash (including his \$20,000.00 bail) and a 1986 Volvo.

March 6: Informant participation and intelligence assisted by high tech surveillance led to probable cause for the arrest of two subjects dealing cocaine. Suspect #1 was lured to an arrest location near his house under the ruse of him selling a quarter ounce of cocaine. When he was taken into custody he was in possession of over one ounce of coke and \$3,218.00 in cash. His 1988 Toyota was seized, and the Task Force Members served a warrant on his residence. At the house, suspect #2 was arrested, along with 360 grams of cocaine (\$36,000.00 value), a handgun and paraphernalia. One suspect has been dealing since 1985, and is a convicted felon and sex offender with four rape convictions.

April 3: Task Force detectives served a search warrant upon a Duvall residence where a cargo container had been converted into a marijuana growing operation, and a garage

next to it was being used as a secondary grow room. The attic above was utilized as a nursery for the starter plants. Following this, a second warrant was served in the same area where the son of the suspect arrested at location #1 had his grow operation. In all, this father-son business resulted in three arrested and 204 marijuana plants seized.

April 21: ENTF detectives worked a joint investigation with DEA involving large-scale sales of methamphetamine. A buy/bust operation was set up in Kirkland, and the suspect was arrested after he delivered over 27 ounces of meth to an undercover agent. In turn, the source was called to pick up the money at a second location, where two other suspects were arrested. A follow up "knock and talk" was conducted at another location where a firearm was seized.

May 12: Information of marijuana being sold on the eastside lead ENTF detectives to serve a search warrant in Snohomish where a large scale marijuana grow operation was under way. Over 400 plants were located inside the residence where the two occupants lived. Along with the large number of plants, a full size Chev Blazer, \$1,780.00 in cash, two guns and nearly three pounds of processed marijuana was seized.

May 27: A four month investigation into an eastside "crack house" operating in Bellevue was brought to a head when the King County SWAT team assisted ENTF detectives in serving a search warrant where ten individuals were located. Following the arrest, nine of the individuals were booked on various charges, 29 grams of powdered cocaine and 13 grams of "crack" cocaine were seized, along with a handgun and \$450.00 cash. This did not persuade the owners of the house to stop their business. On July 10, ENTF and the SWAT team served another warrant on the same house and the nine occupants were all arrested, along with the ringleader, owner of the residence. Upon his release, King Co. detectives on a buy/bust operation arrested him a third time. This subject was released from jail, and resurrected his "crack house" again. ENTF undercover detectives made another buy, and another search warrant was obtained. This time, six individuals were arrested and one ounce of powdered cocaine, thirty "rocks" and \$234.00 cash were located inside the house, along with a handgun, scales and various paraphernalia. The owner was served with papers regarding forfeiture proceedings against his residence.

June 19: Task Force detectives assisted BPD patrol officers regarding a possible methamphetamine lab at a motel in Bellevue. Three adult males from Idaho were lured out of the room on a "ruse" and subsequently arrested on outstanding arrest warrants while a search warrant was being sought. The King County Sheriff's Dept. Clandestine Lab Team served the warrant upon the motel room. A boxed up meth lab was located inside the suspect's van. The lab had all of the chemicals and glassware needed to manufacture methamphetamine, and there was evidence obtained to file charges. On July 2, information was obtained that meth was again being sold or manufactured at the same Bellevue motel. A warrant was served on the motel room and the suspect was located in bed with a loaded shotgun. He was taken into custody, along with 19 grams of meth, scales and packaging material.

July 15: A long-term investigation culminated in the simultaneous service of two search warrants in the Bothell area. Members of the BPD Tactical Arms Group assisted ENTF detectives in this marijuana grow operation. Two houses were searched, and 177 plants confiscated, along with 13 guns, LSD, psilocybin mushrooms, two people arrested and a third party in Canada is being investigated. Seized with the illegal drugs were a min-van, trailer and 5 racing go-carts. Documents lead to a third search warrant at an airplane hanger where three planes at different levels of restoration were located. The financial investigator is looking into the feasibility of their seizure.

October 16: Sometimes it is difficult to produce enough probable cause to obtain a search warrant, even though a detective believes that there is illegal drugs in a residence. A "knock and talk" was conducted on such a house in Kirkland by ENTF detectives, and the owner was told that they suspected him of growing marijuana in the bedroom. He did not consent to a search and went back inside the house. As the detectives stood outside, a large fire broke out in the living room fireplace of this residence and the smell of burning marijuana was overpowering. The detectives returned and knocked on the door, and the suspect came outside. He consented to the search, as did his spouse. 85 mature marijuana plants were recovered from the fireplace, and a large amount of grow equipment seized. (total value: \$170,000.00)

November 19: Following a lengthy investigation which included the assistance of the National Guard C-26 surveillance plane, a search warrant was obtained for a rental house in Carnation where a Kirkland resident was suspected of growing marijuana. The 5-acre home site produced over 140 marijuana plants, including a quaint little nursery in the barn, which had been operating for the past 3 years. Following the seizure of plants and equipment worth over \$379,000.00, information was gained on another grow operation in Seattle, which netted another 100 plants, a certificate of deposit valued at \$136,000.00 and the suspect owns the house free and clear. Total potential value of all property seized is over \$500,000.00.

1998 Summary of Training

January 13TH-16TH: Two Task Force detectives attended a surveillance school at the WSCJTC.

January 20^{TH} - 22^{ND} : One Task Force detective attended the body wire intercept school sponsored by the WSCJTC.

March 9th: A Task Force detective attended the W.S.C.J.T.C. basic eight hour Drug Investigator Training.

April 7TH: All of the ENTF detectives participated in an all day training session put on by TAG members, which included: raid planning, dynamic entries and officer rescue.

April 30th-May 1st: Two detectives attended the W.S.N.I.A. Training Conference.

April 29th-May 1st: The Task Force Secretary and Commander attended the Commander's Conference and the W.S.N.I.A. Training Conference

June 3rd-6th: the Lieutenant and four Task Force detectives attended the annual W.S.I.N. training conference in Sacramento.

June 15th-19th: Two Task Force detectives attended a week long training course on methamphetamine labs presented by the Cadre Company at the BPD training center.

August 4th: All ENTF detectives attended a training day, which included defensive tactics during search warrant operations. They also trained on shooting techniques.

September 9th-11th: The Task Force commander and three detectives along with the narcotics K9 handler attended the quarterly training of W.S.N.I.A. in Wenatchee.

October 19th-21st: the Task Force Commander and Supervisor attended a Task Force Workshop presented by U.S. Dept. of Justice, Bureau of Justice America.

November 20th-24th: The Task Force Commander, K-9 Commander, Drug Dog Handler and two detectives attended the Calif. Narcotic Officers Assoc. training in San Diego.

December 2nd-4th: Lieutenants Kowalczyk and Bryant along with one detective attended the quarterly training of W.S.N.I.A. and O.N.E.A. (Oregon Narcotic Enforcement Assoc.) Training Conference in Beaverton.

December 11th: All members of the ENTF trained all day with the BPD TAG team on entries, raid techniques and shooting skills.











GRAMS BY YEAR












