ROAD SPECIFICATIONS

167th/168th Avenue SE is a 32ft wide inclined and curved road. There are no sidewalks on either side of the road.


RESIDENTIAL STREET




DAILY TRAFFIC


The Mid-Week Average on 167th Avenue SE is 334 cars per day. Mid-Week Average includes data between Tuesday and Thursday.

COLLISIONS

A three-year collision study was conducted along 167th/168th Avenue SE between SE 9th Street and SE 12th Street. There was one reported collision at the intersection of 168th Avenue SE and SE 10th Street, and one reported collision at the intersection



of 167th Avenue and SE 12th Street.



RECOMMENDATIONS

Below are our recommendations for 167th/168th Avenue SE based on the field reviews, data collection, and engineering analysis. More detail on these recommendations are outlined in the Residential Traffic Guidebook (Bellevuewa.gov/ResidentialTrafficGuidebook).

By educating the community and encouraging safe driving, we can begin to change driver behavior and reduce vehicle speeds.









BRUSH TRIMMING

Overgrown brush and trees at intersections, driveways, sidewalks, and along roadways limits motorists' ability to safely navigate neighborhood streets. Overgrown brush can block important signs and limit a driver's ability to see on-coming traffic. Brush trimming targets those trouble areas and increases the visibility of pedestrians, bicyclists, and motorists. The

City has guidelines for sight-lines based on posted speed limits. Tree limbs must be trimmed to above 7 1/2' and bushes below 30".



SIGN & PLEDGE PROGRAM

This program involves lending communities portable signs that encourage motorists to respect the neighborhood, drive responsibly, and drive 25 mph. The signs are moved by community volunteers from place to place throughout the neighborhood every few days. The second part of the program is a neighborhood pace car program. Residents who pledge

to drive responsibly and drive the speed limit on all neighborhood streets receive magnetic bumper stickers or window clings to place on their vehicle. As these motorists drive 25 mph on residential streets, they set the pace for drivers behind them.



RADAR DOLLY

You can borrow and place a radar dolly on your street for up to two weeks. This unit gives motorists feedback on the speed at which they are driving on a digital reader board, encouraging them to obey the speed limit. Should you like to borrow the radar dolly, please request it by calling (425) 452-6457 or sign up on Bellevuewa.gov/RadarDolly. Once we

receive a request, City staff will contact you to make arrangements for both the drop-off and pick-up of the radar dolly at your home.
