Is Your Home Ready for Fall and Winter Storms?

Here's a checklist of important steps to help you prepare. Have you:

- ☐ Cleaned gutters and downspouts twice a year? This helps protect your home from damage when it rains.
- ☐ Checked your property's drainage system? A clogged system can cause property flooding. This is especially important on commercial properties with multiple catch basins or other drainage structures that need regular maintenance.
- ☐ Tested sump pumps?
- ☐ Updated your family emergency kit? You need enough water, food and other supplies to support your home for at least three days. Takewinterbystorm.org has a full list of recommended emergency supplies.
- Prepared (and practiced) a family communications plan during emergencies? See plan templates and ideas at ready.gov.
- Checked your home insurance policy for flood or stormrelated damage coverage?
- Protected your water pipes from freezing by wrapping with tape and insulation in exposed or unheated areas (outdoors, attic, basement, or garage)?

Protect Our Streams

A little oil leak can travel a long way—and turn into big trouble for our local waterways. Rain washes leaked oil, power steering, transmission and brake fluids, and gasoline from driveways, parking lots, and roadways into our storm drains. These drains flow directly to the nearest body of water, where the contaminated water can harm fish and other wildlife.



Fixing leaks immediately helps prolongs the life of your vehicle. It protects your investment as well as our waterways.

If you can't repair the leak right away, place cardboard, drip pans or newspaper under your car while it is parked until you can get it fixed.

To absorb spills and avoid runoff, sprinkle sand or kitty litter over the spill, then sweep up into a bag and put it in the trash.

Save Your Sewer: Dispose of Fats, Oils and Grease Properly

When F.O.G. products (fats, oils and grease) go down your drain, they stick to pipes. This can lead to costly, messy sewer backups in your home—even your neighborhood!

Follow these simple steps to keep greasy food waste out of your pipes:

- Scrape and wipe dishes before washing. This keeps greasy scraps out of the dishwasher and garbage disposal, where they head straight to the sewer. Recycle food scraps in your organics container.
- **2. Use sink strainers to catch food waste** in your sink before it enters the drain.
- 3. For heavy oils and grease: cool it, can it, trash it. Pour fats and grease that turn solid when cooled into a disposable container and put in your garbage. You can recycle used liquid oil in clear, screw-top plastic sealed containers labeled with your name and address. Leave next to your recycling cart and call 425-452-4762 to schedule a pickup.*

Prevent Flooding: Adopt a Drain

Every fall, Bellevue Utilities faces a big job keeping storm drains clear—there are over 20,000 around the city!

You can help prevent flooding on your street by keeping your local storm drain clear of leaves and other debris.

Only clear your drain if it is safe to do so—work from a sidewalk if possible, and stay out of the street. Put all leaves and compostable debris in your organics cart. And please do not dispose of your grass clippings, leaves, or any other debris into drains, ditches, creeks, culverts, gutters, or ravines.
