New Sidewalk on 105th Avenue SE

A Safe Routes to School Project is in design to improve pedestrian safety along 105th Avenue SE, between Wolverine Way and Main Street. This project will build curb, gutter and a 6-foot wide sidewalk on the east side of 105th Avenue SE with parking areas where feasible. The new sidewalk will provide people a place to walk that's away from traffic and formalize parking on the east side of the street. The existing parking shoulder will remain on the west side.

Curb extensions, which narrow the roadway by extending the curb towards the center of the street, will be installed at Cliff Place. The curb extensions will shorten the crossing distance for pedestrians at Cliff Place and address residents' concerns with speeding by encouraging motorists to slow down.

Construction will occur in the public right-of-way.

Homeowners and renters adjacent to the new sidewalk, will be contacted by the project manager with more information on how the sidewalk will connect with their driveway or front yard.

Project schedule

Design work is anticipated to be complete by fall 2020. Construction is expected to occur from fall 2020 to summer 2021, as weather permits.


Funding

This project is funded by the Neighborhood Sidewalks Program and the Neighborhood Safety, Connectivity and Congestion Levy. Estimated cost is \$600,000.


