Whereas: Overlake Medical Center has served the community since 1960 and today is the only Level III

Trauma Center in Bellevue; and

Whereas: The staff at Overlake have been on the front lines in Bellevue for treating patients who are

critically ill with the coronavirus; and

Whereas: The 2,700 staff members at Overlake, including doctors and nurses, are working 24/7 under

stressful conditions; and

Whereas: Approximately 100 physicians have been focused on COVID-19, with a heavy emphasis on

emergency, critical and urgent care; and

Whereas: All of them are putting their own health at risk in order and to treat coronavirus patients and

save lives; and

Whereas: Since late February Overlake has performed thousands of COVID-19 tests and had hundreds of

positive results; and

Whereas: Overlake's census of 50 to 60 COVID-19 patients on any given day is one of the highest counts in

Washington state; and

Whereas: 9 to 12 of those patients are in the critical care unit, with most of them on ventilators; and

Whereas: Overlake's Command Center team has worked tirelessly to make sure the hospital has adequate

supplies;
