

- Responds to state and federal requirements
- Addresses key issues:
 - Regional transit network
 - Environment
 - Innovation & technology
 - o Finance
 - Performance measurement
- 2018 Plan: 2040 horizon year





2022 Regional Transportation Plan

- Builds from VISION 2050
- Objectives:
 - Make progress on existing challenges, address current and future needs of the transportation system
 - Provide better data and analysis to support local investment planning (2024 comprehensive plans)
 - Plan for long-term system investments to accommodate future growth
 - Improve existing system, big picture thinking on future investments (aviation, rail, ferries)




The Coordinated Plan includes:

- Prioritized strategies to address the needs and gaps of special needs transportation populations






Growing Number of People with Special Transportation Needs (2011-2018)



King County Figures


Change in Special Needs Populations, 2011, 2015, and 2018 (King)

Coordinated Transit-Human Services Transportation Plan

Federal & State requirements:

- Outreach to stakeholders in the region
- Identify existing services and unmet needs
- Develop strategies to meet the needs
- Show common origins/destinations and demographics
- Identify technology-based solutions
- Ensure coordination with emergency management agencies







Emerging Needs and Gaps Identified in the Plan

There is a transportation need for:

- More travel training and information assistance and referral services
- Better transportation services within and connecting to rural areas
- More comprehensive access to non-emergency healthcare and associated critical services
- Better coordination between transportation providers and human service agencies
- More sustainable sources of funding







