Hopelink	Financial Assistance; Food; Homeless Housing, Case Management; GED, English for Work, Employment Program	Helps stabilize vulnerable populations experiencing unexpected financial crisis in order to prevent homelessness. Emergency aid is provided for eviction prevention, move-in assistance, motel vouchers, utilities help, transportation assistance, medical prescriptions, and other basic needs. Provides food to supplement and nutrition education for self-sufficiency, including baby items and personal care products. Homeless housing service paired with case management services in three different models: emergency shelter, transitional housing, and permanent housing with supportive services. Case management program that provides support and connection to resources for families with children.
