What does a used toilet paper roll or straw and a dandelion have in common? Here are some ways to create dandelion art!

DANDELION TOILET ROLL ART PROJECT

MATERIALS:

- Empty toilet paper rolls
- Scissors
- Poster paint (any color(s) you want)
- Cotton balls
- Construction paper (any color you want)
- Q-Tips
- Aluminum foil or plastic plate (for paint pallet)

DIRECTIONS:

- To start, pour your paint(s) of choice onto a plastic plate for your paint pallet.
- Next, lay out your construction paper and start cutting fringe at one end of your empty toilet roll(s)
- Dip the fringe-cut side of the toilet roll into your paint color of choice and stamp-painting the dandelion heads on the construction paper
- Grab a Q-Tip and with any color you choose, paint the stems from the dandelion heads
- Use a cotton ball to create "dust" off the dandelion heads
