A TEN-WEEK COURSE ON BELLEVUE CITY GOVERNMENT IN ACTION

What is Bellevue Essentials?

Bellevue Essentials is a ten-week civic engagement program during which you will learn about the structure and daily operations at the City of Bellevue. Hands-on activities allow participants to experience the day-to-day challenges of running a local government. Each session includes some pre-class learning homework, a networking dinner, learning about specific departments and services, and interactive activities. You will talk informally with city staff and leadership and develop close relationships with your classmates. Bellevue Essentials connects residents with the city and provides new leaders with information and connections to help strengthen our community.

The 2021 Bellevue Essentials class is currently scheduled to meet primarily in a live format with some virtual learning via Zoom. The mix of in-person and online learning will be determined by current Covid restrictions.

Who should apply?

Bellevue Essentials cohorts are demographically representative of Bellevue's diverse community. Bellevue Essentials is designed for people who are:

- Curious about civic engagement and participation in local government
- Interested in gaining skills and knowledge around how city government works and how to effectively be involved
- Interested in networking with city staff and leadership and emerging community leaders
- Committed to the future of Bellevue and to serving their community

Every year, Bellevue Essentials receives approximately 70 applications. In 2021, we will be accepting up to 35 applicants, so it is important to thoroughly complete your application. An information meeting, application workshop and one-on-one application assistance are available to all applicants. See insert for details.

Applications are due by 5 p.m. on Friday, July 23, 2021. Tuition is \$125.00 (payable after acceptance) and a fee waiver based on financial need is available.
