



NOTICE OF INSTALLATION:

Crosswalk flashing beacon

156th Avenue SE and SE 4th Street intersection

As requested by the Lake Hills neighborhood through the Neighborhood Enhancement Program, the Bellevue Transportation Department plans to install a rectangular rapid flashing beacon system at the intersection of 156th Avenue SE and SE 4th Street, along with curb ramp improvements and localized asphalt overlay to improve safety and visibility of pedestrians.



What to expect

- **Schedule:** Anticipated to begin in October 2021 with final installation in spring 2022. Schedule is subject to change.
- **Traffic control:** Limited periods of single-lane closures and potential lane shifting.
- **Safety:** Follow flaggers' instructions, obey traffic signs and watch for people walking and biking.
- **Work hours:** 7 a.m.-3:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Funding

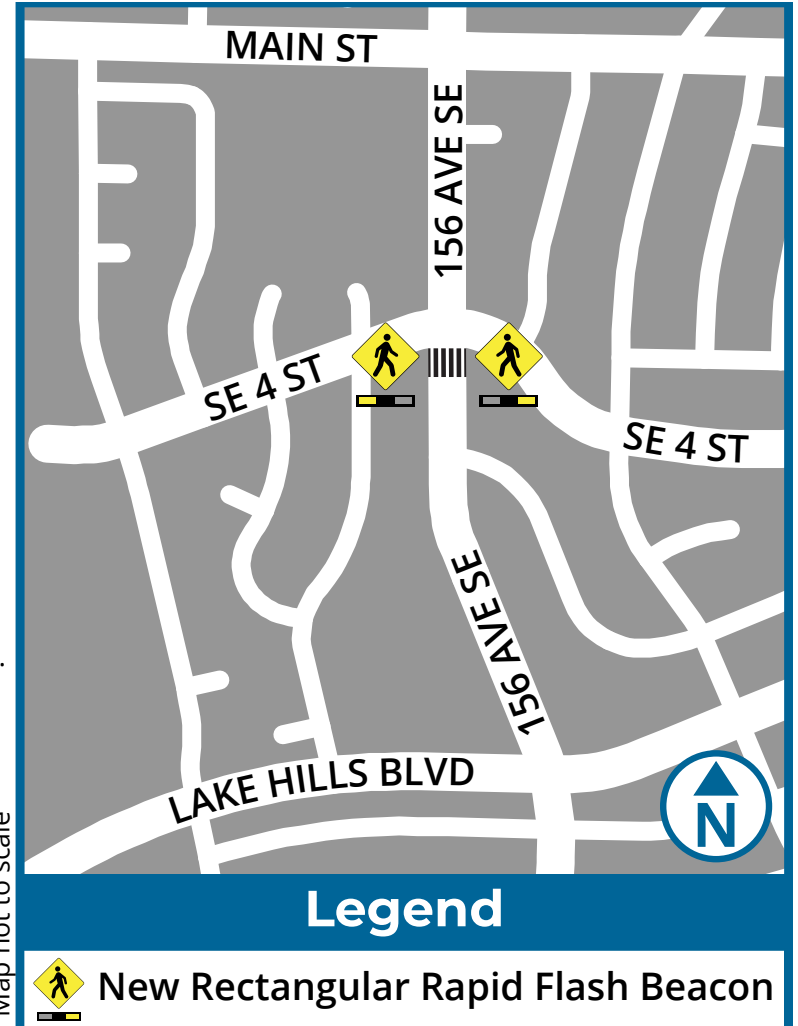
This project is one of three locations funded by the Neighborhood Enhancement Program and Traffic Operations Program. Estimated cost for all three crosswalk improvements is \$440,000

Map not to scale

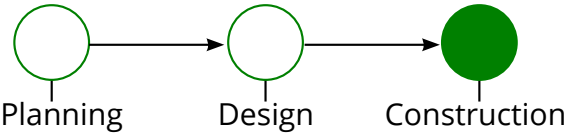
