

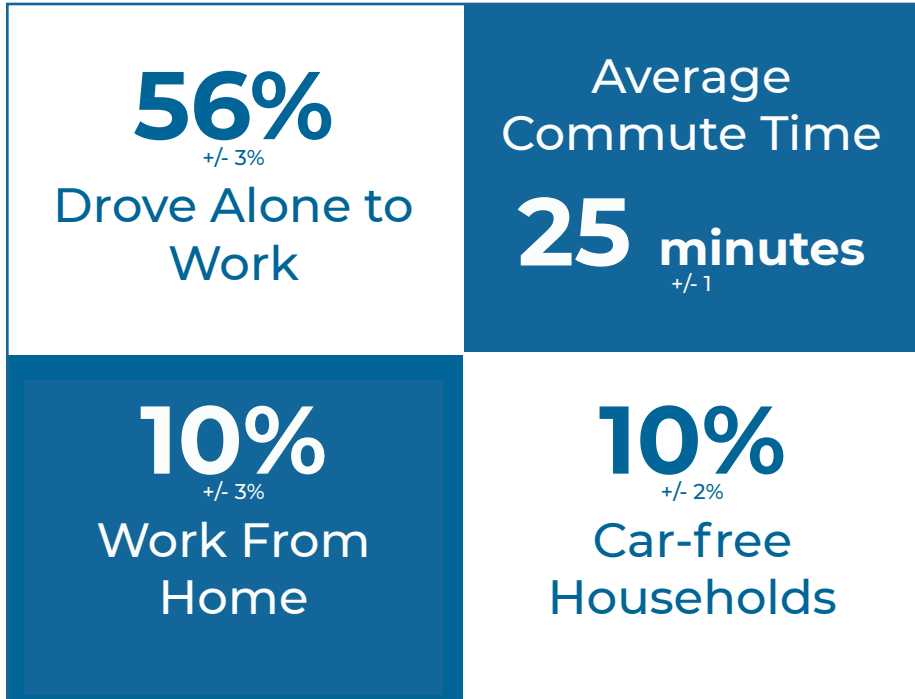

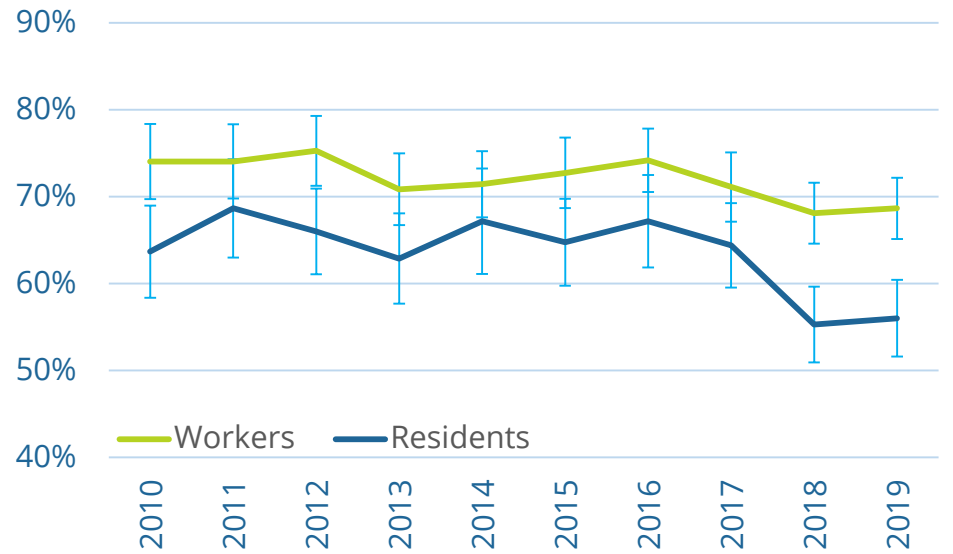

Bellevue is well connected to the rest of the region and its activities via roads and transit.



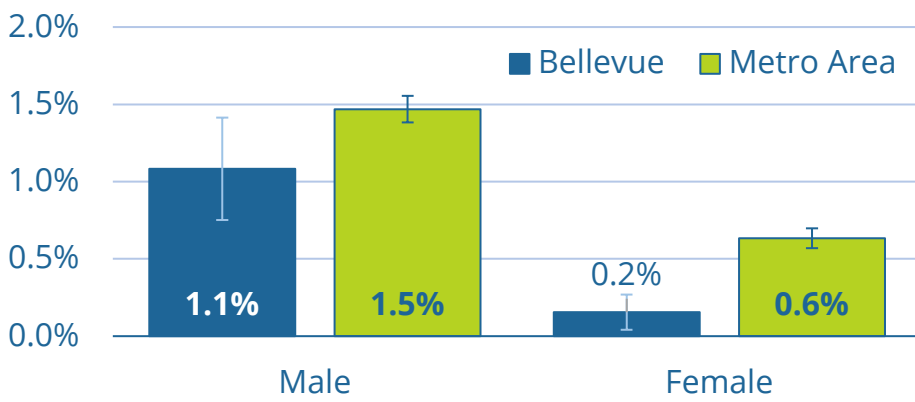

Percent of Workers Who Drove Alone to Work



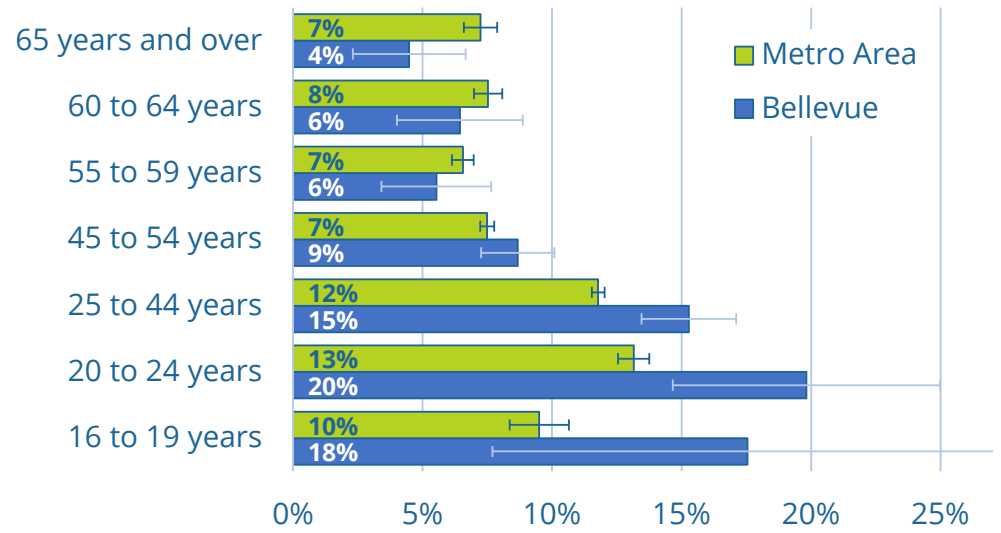

Bicycle Commuters by Gender



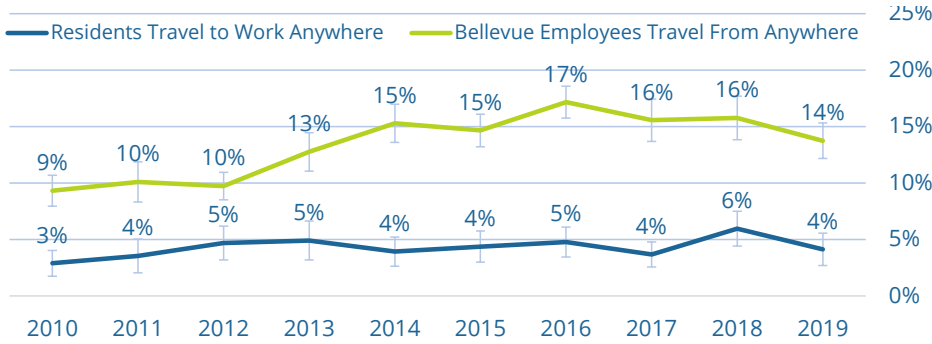

Percent of Workers Who Commute by Public Transit



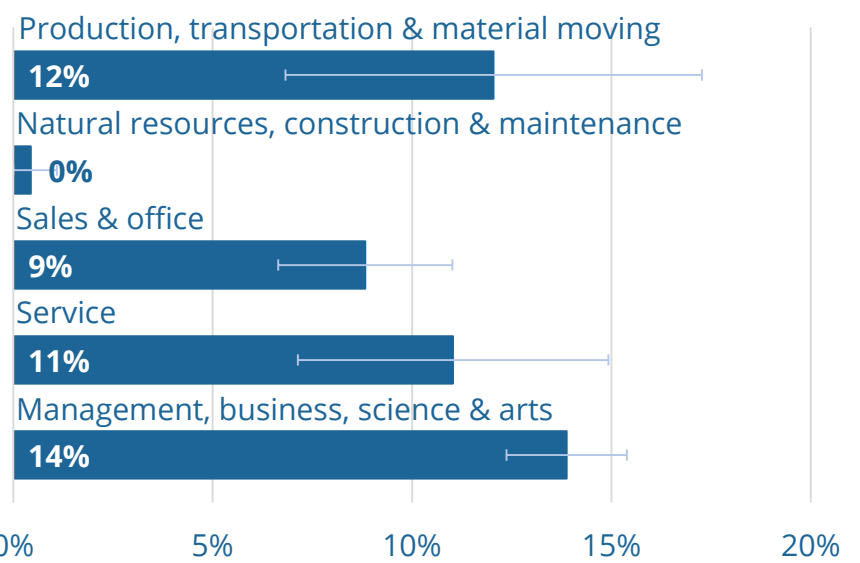

Commute 60 Minutes or More



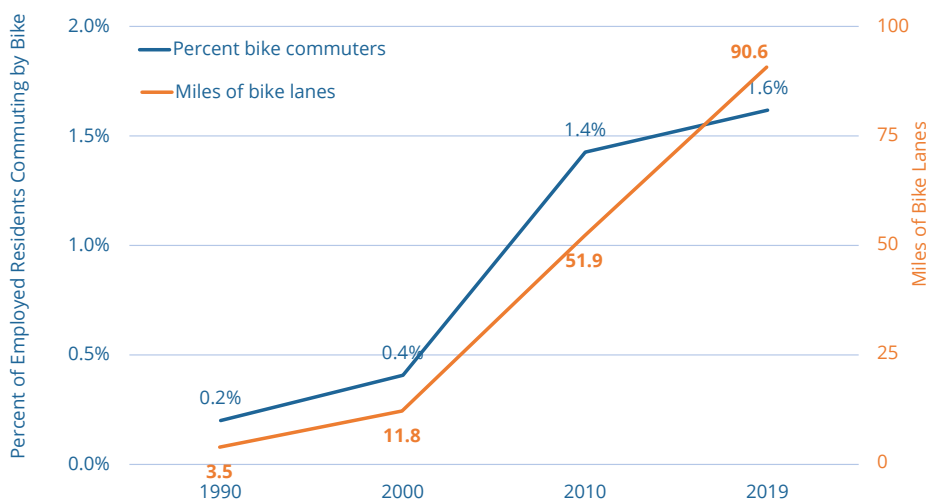

Use of Public Transit by Occupation



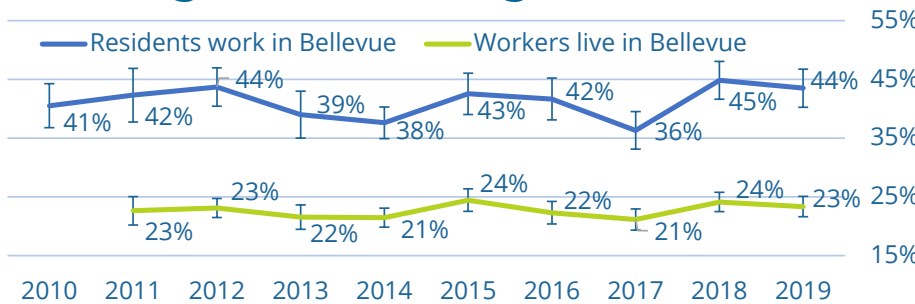
