June is kickoff for Neighbor Link parties and celebrations and community service in **YOUR neighborhood!** There are many reasons to gather, but from those Bellevue residents that have been doing this for some time, the reason is to simply have FUN! Let us help you with your planning to reconnect with long-time and your newest neighbors.

Through our Neighbor Link Program which runs June 1–October 1 we offer the following help in planning for neighborhoods that register their event:

- Publicize the event with Colorful Flyers, a Banner or Sandwich Board graphics
- We encourage Community Service for our Bellevue neighbors and kids in need such as a food drive for Hopelink – End Summer Hunger, or your charity of choice. Other ideas may be to plan an event to help a neighbor in need, or help with stewardship in Bellevue Parks.
- Fun for children, we'll help with the contacts to have a police or firemen/fire truck visit provided availability
- Close Your Street with a city permit and approved road barricades and receive reimbursement up to \$50

Neighbor Link will provide resources for one (1) Party per neighborhood during June 1–Oct. 1. Planning 3 to 4 weeks before the event date is recommended. If you would like to close your street, plan for 6 weeks.

- We provide colorful formats designed by our graphics team, to promote your party. We will print up to 500 flyers, and/or electronic PDF for distribution to publicize the event.
- Neighborhood groups submitting their own graphics must submit a ready to print PDF
- 1 grommeted Banner (3'x6') OR up to 2
 Loanable sandwich-board signs (Includes four,
 23" x 23" posters for front and back)

Overview Getting Started:

- Fill out the electronic Party Planning form found on the city website. Your information will be received by Neighborhood Outreach.
- Talk to Neighborhood Outreach if you plan to submit any requests for permits. Examples are Right-of-way to close a street or Amplified Sound if you are planning for music and entertainment. Be sure to provide lead time of 3 weeks for our technicians to process your request; when you receive your permit number forward to Neighborhood Outreach
- When the permit is approved, you will be sent an electronic notification from MyBuildingPermit.com. During your event you should have available the following documentation: detailed "Final Set" (includes block party conditions, diagram of closure, Transportation Right-of-Way Approval) and the Permit and Inspection Record that highlights the Job Address and Permit Number.
- Complete/Update your Graphics request with any final information for review and confirmation; keep wording brief and simple. The three choices are Block Party, 4th of July, and National Night Out





Block Party Planning

Neighborhood Block Parties & Safely Closing Your Street





Increase the number of residents participating in your neighborhood block parties by closing your street to traffic. The city will cover the cost of your permit and provide reimbursement up to \$50 for the cost of approved Type III barricades with road closed signs. In closing a street for a neighborhood gathering, you are bringing the party directly to residents who may not otherwise participate. Think of the seniors in your neighborhood who may not wish to leave their homes or have trouble

traveling. Having your home nearby is convenient for access to kitchens, bathrooms, etc. Children have an opportunity to play games in the street, ride their bikes, and visit with their friends. The process for street closure begins by getting permission to have the party, which allows you to introduce yourself to neighbors. Anticipation and planning the event generates buzz and excitement with neighbors asking, "how can I help?"





Neighbor Link will:

- Walk you through the electronic permitting process for a safe street closure with guidance from the Transporation Department.
- Neighborhood Outreach will work with the resident and the Transportation Department. In accordance with the City's noise ordinance, permits involving activities going beyond 8 p.m. Sunday-Thursday and 10 p.m. Friday-Saturday, will not be issued.
- The city will issue one right-of-way permit per neighborhood free of charge
- Provide reimbursement for up to \$50 toward the cost of approved Type III barriers with paid receipts

Electronic Permitting to Close Your Street

Neighborhood block party organizers who wish to close a street can submit one unique request per street location during the block party season, June 1-Oct. 1 through My Building Permit, https://mybuildingpermit.com. The permit fee will be waived.

Permitting/Transportation Right-of-Way will review your materials and deliver your permit electronically to your email account. Allow 30 business days from your planned event for your request to be processed. The organizer is responsible for obtaining the recommended number and type of safety barricade. There should be continuous traffic flow around the street closure without anyone having to make a U-Turn. Please note that major arterials cannot be closed. Please note that there are restrictions on the types of arterials that can be closed.



Step 1: Gather your materials

- ✓ Residents collect approval signatures from neighbors to close the street
- ✓ A map of the street you wish to close (can be a Google or Bing Map; save in PDF form)

Tip: Please contact Right-of-Way or Neighborhood Outreach for guidelines on how to safely




close your street. Once you have determined and mapped your safe closure, Neighborhood Outreach will provide a form/petition to gather resident signatures/addresses. You must obtain email or paper signature approval, from 80% of the interested parties who have access points (roads or driveways) that may touch the street being closed. These signatures will be part of your application and must be uploaded as part of your permit documentation.






Step 2: Residents Set-up your permitting account and submit your request

To fill out the Right of Way application or the Amplified Sound application, go to https://mybuildingpermit.com/. Click "Apply for Permit" and "Register Now" (if you do not already have an account).

Right of Way Application Required Documents/Supplementals (See Step 1):

- City approved road closure map in PDF format
- Neighborhood agreement petition
- City of Bellevue staff contact: Neighborhood Outreach

AMPLIFIED SOUND APPLICATION:

Planning for a band or outside entertainment? You will need to complete an amplified sound application. The sound permit fee is not waived.

Pathway to sound from mybuildingpermit.com:

> Jurisdiction: Bellevue

> Application type: Land Use

➤ Project type: Nonresidential or Multifamily Residential or Single Family Residential

➤ Activity type: Deviations, Modifications, Variances or Waivers

> Scope of work: Noise

> Select "there is amplified outdoor sound"

Step 3: Order Your Barricades

RESIDENTS ORDER BARRICADES

■ National Barricade LLC: 206-523-4045

■ Traffic Control Services: 425-658-3655

■ NW Barricade and Signs 206-243-8004

- Order approved number of Type III barricades (68x30), with Road Closed sign (48 x 30)
- Cost for 2 barricades: rental, delivery, and tax, is approximately \$75-\$125
- (With paid receipt, the organizer will receive up to \$50 reimbursement by Neighborhood Outreach).

Step 4: Following your Event, Submit Your Paid Receipts for up to \$50 Reimbursement
