

Total Two-Year Budget \$2.2B





How did we spend the \$950M Operating Budget?




Overview of Revenue – General Fund



- Sales Taxes Overall 5% to 6% growth
- B&O Taxes Includes job growth
- Property Taxes 1% with Council approval plus New Construction
- Utilities Taxes Rates and decrease in land lines/cell data; 2-3% growth
- Misc. Revenues Includes Grants, Debt Services, Transfers, and Reserves



General Fund Sustainability: What has the City done?

• Prior to 2023/2024 -

- Intentionally built reserves
- Adjusted1 percent Councilmanic property tax
- Implemented Fire inspection fees
- Reduced ongoing costs in 2021/2022: (total ~~\$8M annually)

2023-2024 proposes additional revenue adjustments

- 2% Property Tax (~~\$18 per \$1M property owner) \$1M
- Business & Occupation tax \$3.5M
- Land Use Permit fees \$1M

These actions have all taken steps toward fiscal sustainability, yet do not solve the structural deficit and they do assist in the near term....




Public Involvement: What we heard


- Budget, Performance and Business

 - 2,137 responses across all surveys
 - Key Takeaways:
 - 97% of residents say that Bellevue is a "good" to "excellent" place to live
 - Affordability/cost of living, public safety and homelessness were largest areas of concern




Budget Survey: Overall Quality of Life


