

Hate Crimes and Bias Incidents – 2022

A **hate crime** involves the suspect committing a crime motivated by the suspects perception of the victim’s race, color, sexual orientation etc. and a **bias incident** is an act of prejudice that is not criminal and does not involve threats, violence, or property damage. A bias incident may include yelling profanity and insults, distributing racist flyers in public places, and displaying hateful materials on private property.

In 2022 there were 23 hate crimes (criminal) and 5 bias incidents (non-criminal).

The hate crimes and bias incidents reported in 2022 were as follows:
