

Saturday, April 29th was one of the first sunny and warm days of Spring. This brought many visitors to the farm to see the sheep being shorn of their winter coats. There were several food vendors serving a variety of food options, tractor-pulled wagon rides, fiber craft demonstrations, and Country Lane children's area, providing crafts and activities. Shearing demonstrations took place at the top of each half hour. The amphitheater was full each time.

What went well: (parking, load-in/out, set-up/take down, shuttle, pedestrian flow) The site plan used the whole site, spreading out the activites, dispersing the volume of visitors, as well as, controling the length of lines. There were site maps with QR code which assisted the visitors in locating a specific area or to see the overview of the event.

There were shuttle buses taking people to and from Bannerwood Park and Wilburton Park and Ride. A police officer was stationed at the entrance of the park, helping with traffic control and keeping pedistreans safe.

Over several days, the City's Grounds crew and Structual team assisted the Kelsey Creek Staff in setting-up the event. Clean-up went extremely well. We were impressed with the speed at which volunteers and staff worked to get things put away by the end of the day.

The Country Lane children's area was very popular. The kids seemed to really enjoy all the activities!

Challenges:

We had a last minute cancellation by the pony ride vendor. The night before the event we had to tear-down the pony area fencing, ticketbooth, etc.. A lot of last minute work and wasted set-up time. We printed signage explaining the the activity was cancelled due to the lack of staffing by the vendor.

Exhibitors set up their booths as scheduled and the cl;ean up crew of BBRC did a good job of cleaning up after the event. We had many donors and exihbitors who provided food and drinks that helped made the 2023 AIFA a fun in-person event.

Challenges:

Not a lot of challenges. We have to make some tweaks on the registration so late comers can be better accommodated. The weather is always a challenge but we had people working on the weather and the morning turned out to be perfect for the race event.

Safety/Security Concerns:

The event were well supported by the City of Bellevue Traffic Police and the required number of volunteers. The race started and finished without any untoward incidents.

Changes for next year:

We will be working on the finer points of the process now that we have returned to a 100% inperson event. We increased participants by almost 20% and we hope to build on the success we attained in 2023.
