BIKE BELLEVUE



The city has started work on Bike Bellevue, a new project aimed at improving the bicycle network in the Downtown, Wilburton and BelRed neighborhoods. Improvements are being considered on the Bike Bellevue corridors shown in green on the map above. The goal of Bike Bellevue is to enhance the city's multimodal transportation system by making it safer, more equitable, sustainable and accessible for everyone.
