Twelve-week course on Bellevue city government in action

What is Bellevue Essentials?

Bellevue Essentials is a 12-week civic engagement program that will open your eyes to the "who", "what" and "why of City government and the avenues to get involved. You will experience the daily structure and operations of city government - the work, the challenges, and the collaboration between staff and community that make Bellevue a great place to live, work and play. Hands-on activities allow you to experience the day-to-day challenges of running a local government. Each session includes some pre-class homework, a networking dinner, and presentations and activities from different city departments.

Who should apply?

Bellevue Essentials cohorts are demographically representative of Bellevue's diverse community. Bellevue Essentials is designed for people who are:

- Curious about civic engagement and participation in local government
- Interested in gaining skills and knowledge around how city government works and how to effectively be involved
- · Interested in meeting city staff
- Committed to the future of Bellevue and to serving their community
- · Live or work in Bellevue. Residents are given priority.
- Elected officials and candidates are not eligible to apply

Every year, Bellevue Essentials receives nearly twice as many applicants as we can accommodate. In 2024, we will accept 35 applicants, so it is important to thoroughly complete your application.

Applications are due on Sunday, July 21 at 5 p.m. Tuition is \$200.00 (payable after acceptance) and a fee waiver based on financial need is available.

What is the class schedule?

- Class is held Wednesday evenings, September 11, 18, 25, October 9, 16, 23, 30, November 13, 20. Class is also held on Monday evening, September 30 and Saturday, September 21 and October 5.
- Graduation is Wednesday, Dec. 4, 7-9 p.m.



- Evening classes have dinner at 5:30 p.m. and class from 6-8:30 p.m. Saturday classes include coffee and lunch.
- Attendance is required at 10 of 12 classes to graduate. Please check your schedule to make sure you can make these dates.

Since 2013, over 370 participants have graduated from the Bellevue Essentials program.
