

Keep Bellevue Beautiful Volunteer Safety Guidelines




Thank you for volunteering with the city's Keep Bellevue Beautiful program. It is required that all volunteers, or their parent or legal guardian, complete a waiver of liability form and submit it to the Keep Bellevue Beautiful Coordinator.

Please carefully review the safety rules and guidelines below to ensure a fun and safe cleanup event.

Keep Bellevue Beautiful - Volunteer Safety Guidelines

General Safety

Do not go into the street, median or roundabout to remove litter. Avoid areas that are under construction or that have steep or unstable surfaces. Never reach or crawl into crevices, brush, under rocks or structures to retrieve litter.

Always stay on public property.

Wear your gloves while picking up litter and utilize the litter grabber as much as possible.

Cross streets at crosswalks only, obey traffic signals, walk in the direction that faces on-coming traffic, do not cut through parking lots, and be aware of your surroundings.

Do not wear headphones, horseplay, play pranks, or climb on structures such as fences. Accompany and watch all minor children 13 and under carefully.

Please make sure your belongings and valuables are secure prior to beginning the cleanup.

If you're feeling sick, please head home and feel better soon! There will be more volunteer opportunities available in the future and your wellness and safety are the most important.

Hazardous Items and Reporting

UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES SHOULD ANY VOLUNTEER PICK UP HAZARDOUS MATERIALS.

The Team Leader will be responsible for flagging the location and reporting the hazardous items to the Keep Bellevue Beautiful Coordinator.

When cleaning up in public spaces, be respectful of any person experiencing homelessness and leave camps and personal property items in place. Be mindful of personal safety and do not clean near tents or encampments. Please report encampments on the MyBellevue app.

Emergencies

Report all injuries or incidents to the Team Leader and Keep Bellevue Beautiful Coordinator.

Call 9-1-1 for any major incidents, injuries, or dangerous encounters.

Youth Volunteers

Under 14 years old: Must have a parent/guardian accompany them during the cleanup.

Ages 14-17 years old:

Must have a parent/guardian sign the liability waiver, but do not need a parent/guardian present at the cleanup

Litter doesn't have to be big to create a big impact!

Don't be discouraged if you are cleaning up a site that only has small pieces of litter or debris, such as candy wrappers or cigarette butts. These types of litter are still very damaging to the overall health of Bellevue's environment.

If the location does not look very littered, safely take a closer look along the edge of curbs or along the brush-line where litter tends to accumulate.
