About Bellevue Communications Support

Bellevue Communications Support (BCS) is a group of volunteer amateur radio operators serving the Office of Emergency Management of the City of Bellevue Fire Department. BCS provides auxiliary communications support to the City of Bellevue in times of disaster or emergency.



BCS Activities

- Maintain Bellevue emergency operations center (EOC) radio room amateur radio equipment including HF, VHF, and UHF radios with voice, Winlink, and digital modes
- Maintain and test cached amateur radio go-kits
- Participate in regional communications exercises organized by Washington State
- Participate in City of Bellevue and regional disaster preparedness drills
- Monthly meetings with a variety of amateur radio, emergency communications, and preparedness topics
- Weekly check-in nets for members and visitors on Thursday evenings per the schedule and frequencies below

How to Volunteer

Active and Reserve Membership

Membership is contingent on a successful background check. Active membership is granted based on participation in BCS actvities. Active members maintain the







highest levels of access and readiness to deploy when called upon by OEM.

Members with lower participation are placed on the reserve members roster. Reserve members are able to participate in BCS activities but hold lower levels of access. They may still be called on for deployment and familiarity with BCS infrastructure and procedures will be invaluable.

Leadership Opportunities

Members can be nominated to serve as one of three BCS officer positions with a 3-year term. Officers work with the City of Bellevue liaison to set BCS goals and fulfill the needs of OEM. Other leadership opportunities are also available.

All members are encouraged to share their knowledge by presenting during monthly meetings, elmering, as well as defining and organizing team projects.
