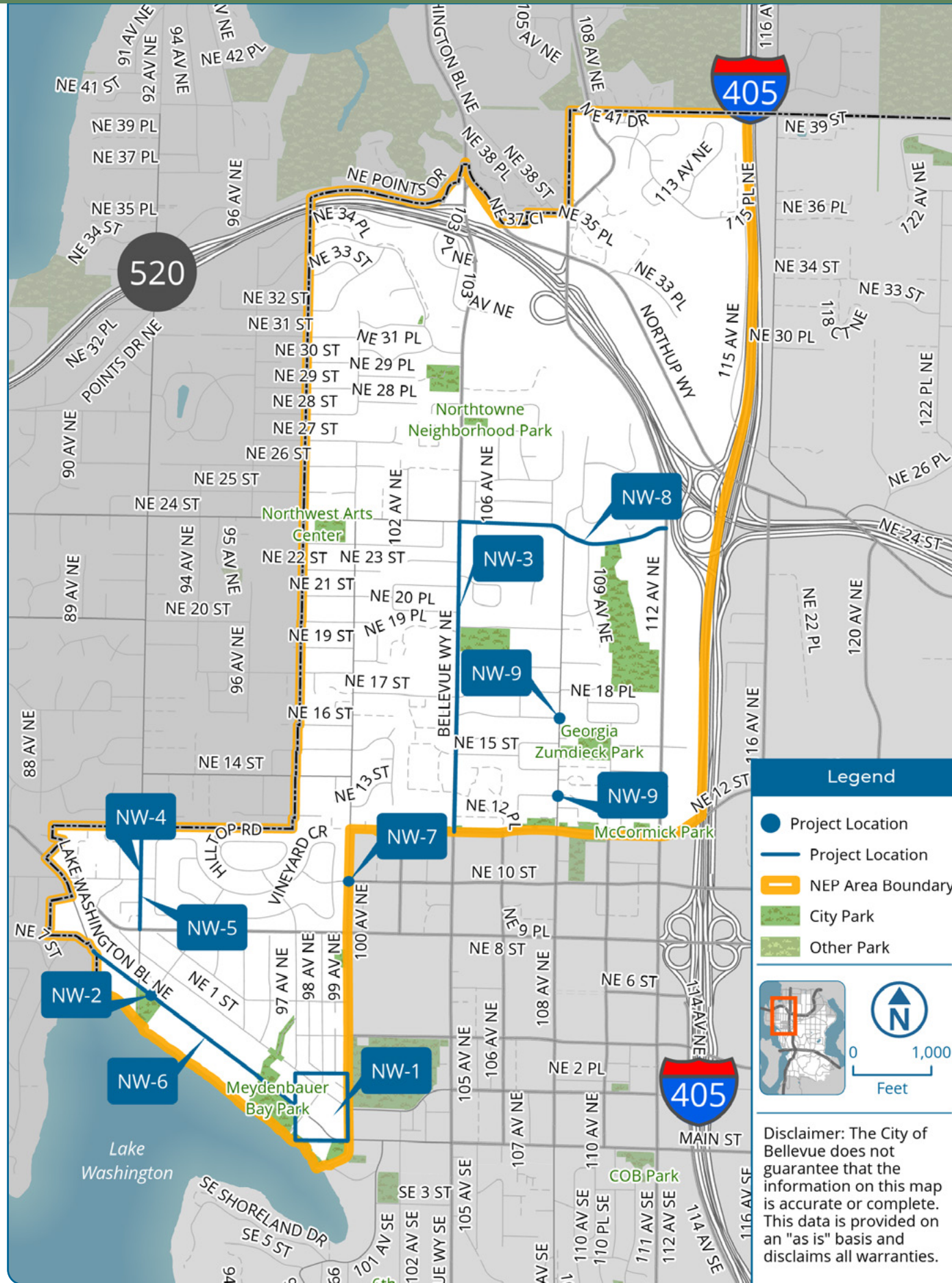

Northwest Bellevue VOTER'S PAMPHLET & BALLOT

It's what you've been waiting for...time to vote!

The Northwest Bellevue area has received \$380,000 to implement residents' desired enhancement projects, and we need your vote!

Earlier this year, the city received 98 submissions from Northwest Bellevue residents to enhance the livability of Northwest Bellevue in various ways. Using these requests, we were able to generate nine enhancement projects, which are described in this pamphlet. The requests that were not developed into projects either did not meet the NEP criteria, were referred to other city departments, or are being addressed by ongoing, city work programs.

Please identify on your ballot, in priority order, which three projects you feel are most deserving of these funds. Three points will be assigned to your first choice, two to your second, and one to your third. We will tabulate your responses and fund the highest scoring projects with the \$380,000 NEP allocation. You will receive a newsletter in late November 2025 with information on the winning projects and the associated project managers, which will also be posted on the NEP website (BellevueWA.gov/nep)

Neighborhood Enhancement Program Proposed Projects

NW-1: Meydenbauer Area Wayfinding Signage
\$20,000

Meydenbauer Bay Park area

This project would install pedestrian and bicycle wayfinding signs and posts to Meydenbauer Bay Park and to Downtown Park.

NW-2: RRFB Crossing Improvements at Lake Washington Boulevard NE and 94th Ave NE
\$350,000

Lake Washington Boulevard NE and 94th Ave NE

This project would install a new pedestrian-activated flashing system at the existing crosswalk over the north west leg of Lake Washington Boulevard NE and 94th Ave NE. Flashing beacons would be added on each side of the street and crosswalk markings will be added to the north east leg. The proposed project includes associated street lighting upgrades, reducing the curb radius, updating curb ramps, and crosswalk markings if needed.

NW-3: Bellevue Way NE Landscape Enhancement
\$265,000

Bellevue Way NE, between NE 12th St and NE 24th St

This project would involve landscape renovation and beautification of Streetscape beds on the West side of Bellevue Way. Work would focus on removal of existing turfgrass in curbside beds, and the soil and irrigation would be improved to support new landscaping. Plants would be chosen specifically to avoid sight-distance problems and integrate with previous phases of renovation. Opportunities for additional renovation in this section would be considered where practical.

NW-4: 92nd Ave NE Invasive Plant Removal
\$62,000

92nd Ave NE at NE 8th St to Clyde Hill City Limit

This project would involve a one-time removal of invasive vegetation along the East side of 92nd Ave NE in the Right of Way. Project would remove invasive species such as ivy, blackberry and holly, remove accumulated debris, mulch the exposed areas and support 2 years of vegetation suppression.

NW-5: Traffic Calming on 92nd Ave NE
\$200,000

92nd Ave NE between NE 8th St and Clyde Hill City Limits

This project would provide traffic calming elements on 92nd Avenue NE from NE 8th Street to Clyde Hill City Limits, such as speed humps or speed cushions, intersection tightening, or raised crosswalks at select locations.

NW-6: Radar Feedback Signs on Lake Washington Blvd between 99th Ave NE and Overlake Dr
\$150,000

Lake Washington Blvd between 99th Ave NE and Overlake Dr

This project would install two speed radar feedback signs, one in each direction, on Lake Washington Boulevard between 99th Avenue NE and Overlake Drive.

NW-7: Vuecrest Utility Box Wrap
\$4,000

At the mini roundabout located at the northwest corner of Belfair Ln and 100th Ave NE

This project would wrap the existing silver utility box with custom artwork that draws inspiration from vintage Vuecrest promotional materials. This project would include hiring a local artist, managed by the City of Bellevue's Arts Program, to develop designs for the utility box. Existing vintage Vuecrest promotional materials would be provided to the artist for their use in creating custom designs.

NW-8: Traffic Calming on NE 24th St
\$200,000

NE 24th St between Bellevue Way and 112th Ave NE

This project would provide traffic calming elements on NE 24th Street from Bellevue Way to 112th Avenue NE, such as speed humps or speed cushions, and intersection tightening.

NW-9: New Marked Crosswalks on 108th Ave NE at NE 17th St and NE 13th St
\$300,000

108th Ave NE and NE 17th St & 108th Ave NE and NE 13th St

This project would install new marked crosswalks at 108th Ave NE and NE 17th St and 108th Ave NE and NE 13th St. Crosswalk markings would be added across 108th Ave NE. The proposed project includes associated street lighting upgrades, reducing the curb radius, updating curb ramps, and crosswalk markings if warranted.
