

## Other agencies that can be useful:

### Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS):

Go in person to apply for EBT (food stamps), Aged, Blind and Disabled (ABD) cash assistance, long term care insurance and more.

### Department of Licensing (DOL):

Clients can reach out to the homelessness outreach team for assistance in setting up an appointment and paying for an ID. Washington DOL will issue a one-time free state-issued ID to individuals experiencing homelessness. DSHS (see above) issues a vouchers to all recipients of DSHS assistance that reduces the regular cost of a state-issued ID to \$5.

# A Guide to Homelessness Services in Bellevue

The City of Bellevue's Homelessness Outreach Team works out of Bellevue City Hall (450 110th Ave NE, Bellevue, WA 98004).

The team helps individuals experiencing homelessness with applying to housing and finding shelter, applying for government benefits, and obtaining documentation such as state-issued IDs, birth certificates and social security cards.

## Definitions

**Day Center:** A place to go during the day with services in the building.

**Safe Parking:** A place to park a car overnight for individuals living in their vehicles.

**Shelter:** A place to sleep at night with some amenities depending on the program.
