

Innovation Forum Inaugural Civic Challenge

As part of Bellevue's Innovation Forum, the city seeks innovative design partnerships to address civic challenges and city priorities. Bellevue anticipates awarding 3-5 recipients in the inaugural event. Applicants should have —or be in the process of building —technology or business solutions that support priorities identified in any of the following documents:

- Bellevue's Strategic Target Areas and Objectives
- Bellevue's Council Priorities
- Department Ideas and Challenges

The inaugural Civic Challenge is open to individuals, teams, students, start-ups, and businesses.

Civic Challenge Award Recipients receive:

- 1. Coaching and mentoring from seasoned entrepreneurs, advisors, and investors
- 2. Design partnership with City of Bellevue staff to help test, optimize, and/or refine a product or service
- 3. Opportunity to showcase solutions for a Civic Tech audience and build relationships across the innovation ecosystem
- 4. Up to a \$15,000 stipend

Challenge participants will be evaluated on the following criteria:

- 1. **Community Engagement and Inclusion:** How does the broader community benefit from your idea? Do you work with students, non-profits, or community members? How does the proposal support equity and the needs of underserved populations?
- 2. Alignment with the City of Bellevue's Priorities: How does the proposal support the city priorities identified?
 - a. <u>Bellevue's Strategic Target Areas and Objectives</u>
 - b. Bellevue's Council Priorities
 - c. Department Ideas and Challenges
- 3. **Feasibility, Sustainability, Ability to Deliver:** Is the solution mature enough to deploy in Bellevue? Is it applicable and replicable to other governments or communities? Can the team succeed in moving the idea forward? Describe how your idea/product/process might scale.
- 4. **Innovative Approaches:** Are innovative and/or modern technology practices and approaches used? Bellevue seeks innovative solutions including processes, AI, data analytics, 5G, digital twins, edge computing, and smart technologies. How do innovative approaches help support better service delivery or outcomes?
