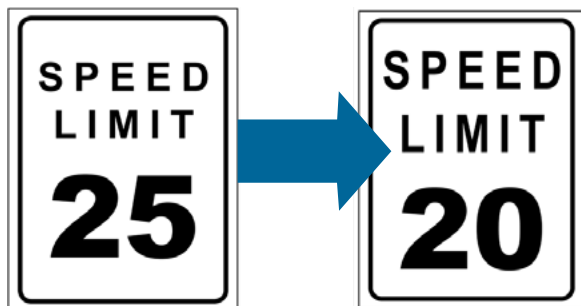


Slower speed limits coming soon to Bellevue neighborhoods!



Starting in spring 2026, the speed limit on most local streets in Bellevue (see map on reverse) will be lowered from 25 mph to 20 mph.

Why are we lowering the speed limit?

- Slower speeds lower the risk of injury to people walking and rolling.
- A lower speed limit encourages people to drive slower, making it more comfortable for people walking and rolling.
- It supports the city's Vision Zero initiative, which aims to eliminate traffic deaths and serious-injury collisions on city streets by 2030.
- 20 mph speed limits in Bellevue have been proven to decrease high-end speeding.

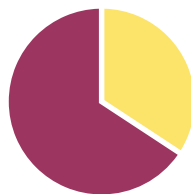
What changes will happen?

- Replace existing 25 mph speed limit signs with 20 mph speed limit signs and replace sign posts that do not meet current city standards.
- Install additional 20 mph speed limit signs, as funds allow.
- Replace existing "25 MPH" pavement marking legends with "20 MPH" legends.
