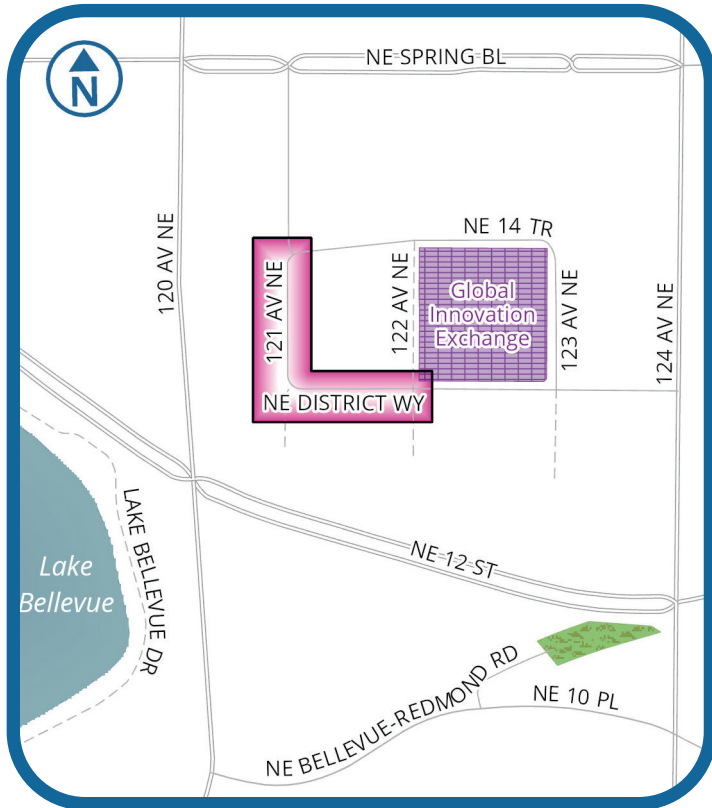

Considerations:

Preferred Dates:

Weekends or Weekdays

Preferred Times:

AM or PM events

Event Length: Minimum 3 hours (inclusive of setup, event, takedown)

Starting costs for event (2026)

Special Event Permit costs:

\$62 processing fee;

\$1,570 permit fee (up to 5,000 participants)

Police Cost range:

\$129/hr/officer for staffing road closures + safety needs

Barricade Rental cost range:

\$820 - \$1,330

General Notes:

1. Events in this location must apply for a Special Event Permit.
2. Event organizers should:
 - a. Assume police staffing will be required at each signalized and/or major intersection. For police costs, assume a rate of approximately \$129/hour/officer (2026).
 - b. Recognize that the number of police officers required depends on the size of the closure and scale of the event.
 - c. Plan for volunteers or other flaggers to help control driveways and minor intersections.
 - d. Develop a transportation plan that describes how you will provide and advertise travel options for attendees. The transportation plan should encourage use of public transit, walking, bicycling, and rolling. If you expect many people to drive to your event, clearly identify approved locations and confirm authorization from the property owner. Use of large off-site garages and lots in City parks are not permitted unless explicitly approved by the property owner.
3. Every event is unique. All recommended event location resources should be consider a starting point for organizers but does not guarantee approval of a Special Event Permit. Recommendations are subject to change.

GENERAL NOTES

1. ALL SIGNS AND SPACING SHALL CONFORM TO THE MUTCD AND CITY OF BELLEVUE SPECS.
2. NOTIFY POLICE, FIRE, AMBULANCE DISPATCH OF CLOSURE TIMES, DATES, AND LOCATION.
3. ALERT METRO TRANSIT 5 DAYS IN ADVANCE (IF APPLICABLE)
4. PROTECTIVE VEHICLE RECOMMENDED-MAY BE A WORK VEHICLE.
5. DEVICES SHOULD NOT ENCR OACH INTO ADJACENT LANES.
6. ALL SIGNS 36" X 36" FLORDG UNLESS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED.
7. CHANNELIZATION DEVICES ARE 28" REFL. CONES. (see TABLE 1 for spacing distances)
8. ALL SPACING MAY BE ADJUSTED TO ACCOMMODATE AT GRADE INTERSECTIONS AND/OR DRIVEWAYS.

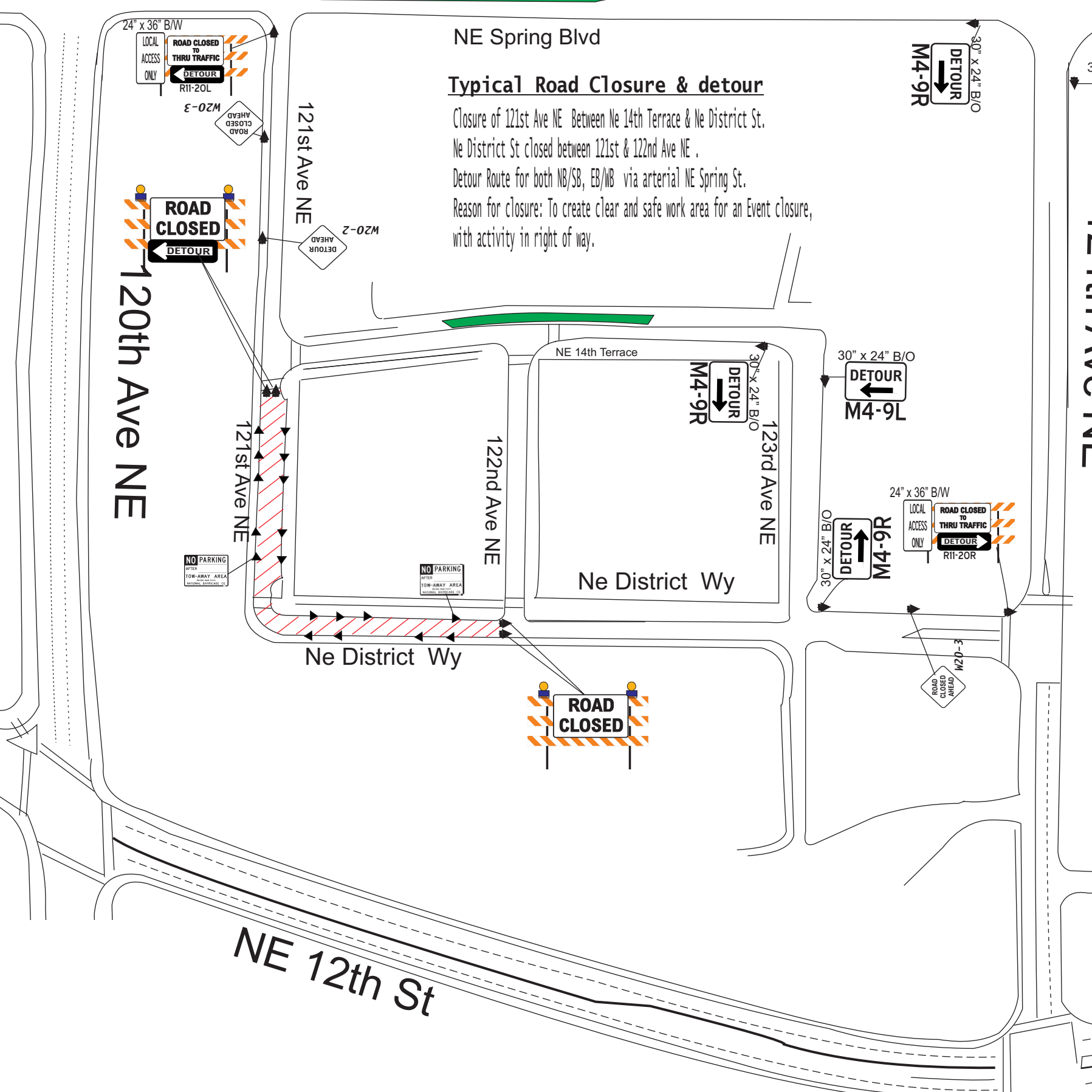

 Detour Route for both NB/SB, EB/WB via arterial NE Spring St.
