# Bike lane and bike signal installation; Bus platform, crosswalk and median installation

#### **Project Description and Benefits**

The Bellevue Transportation Department will:

- Add separated and striped bike lanes on both sides of SE Eastgate Way along most of the two-mile corridor between Richards Road and SE 35th Place. Curb and post dividers and other features will be installed at key locations to increase separation between people bicycling and motor vehicle drivers. These features will help make the I-90 corridor safer and more comfortable for people to bike, connecting them to the I-90 Trail at both ends and providing access to destinations like the Eastgate Park-and-Ride, Bellevue College and offices.
- Build a new bus stop platform, crosswalk and median at SE Eastgate Way and 146th Place SE. This will provide a safer street crossing and waiting area for people who use existing bus stops served by King County Metro routes 217,221, 226, 245, 271 and 888.

#### **Construction Schedule**

Construction begins spring 2019 and includes paving as part of the city's annual Overlay Program. Lane restriping work is planned for summer 2019. Bike signal, bus platform, crosswalk and median work to occur Monday-Friday, 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Restriping work to occur 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Project construction is anticipated to be completed in August 2019.


#### **Project Construction Funding**
