

Construction Alert

158th Place SE Sidewalk Project

March 2019

Sidewalk installation, water main replacement, crosswalk enhancement and pavement improvements

Project Description

The Bellevue Transportation Department plans to:

- Replace water main on 158th Place SE between Lake Hills Blvd. and Main Street
- Construct a 6-foot wide sidewalk on east side of 158th Place SE, between SE 6th Street and Main Street
- Replace traffic circle at intersection of 158th Place SE and SE 4th Street
- Construct rapid rectangular flashing beacon system to enhance crosswalk safety at intersection of 159th Place SE and Lake Hills Blvd.
- Resurface pavement on 158th/159th Place SE between Lake Hills Blvd. and Main Street

What To Expect and When

The city's contractor, Laser Underground, is expected to start work late March 2019 and complete it by fall 2019. Work hours will be Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. There will be intermittent lane closures. Access to driveways will be maintained during construction.

For Your Safety

Please use caution, drive safely and obey flaggers directing motorists throughout the construction zone. Please pay close attention to people walking and biking in the area.

Construction Funding

Construction funding comes from the Neighborhood Safety, Connectivity and Congestion Reduction Levy and the Utilities Department water main replacement program. Estimated construction cost: \$2.2 million.
