The Neighborhood Safety, Connectivity and Congestion Levy - Bellevue's first transportation levy approved by voters in November 2016 - supports the planning, design, construction and outreach of projects.

The Neighborhood Safety, Connectivity and Congestion Levy

- Addresses backlog of projects
- Leverages investment through grant opportunities
- Supplements existing transportation programs
- Generates \$7.4 million per year
- Assesses 15 cents per \$1,000 of assessed value
- Sunsets in 2036

Levy-funded projects fall into the following six areas:



NEIGHBORHOOD SAFETY



- Crosswalks
- School zone flashing beacons
- Speed radar signs
- Traffic calming enhancements



BICYCLE FACILITIES



- New bike lanes
- Extend existing bike lanes
- Additional pavement markings (sharrows)
- New wayfinding signs



NEW SIDEWALKS, TRAILS AND PATHS



- Pedestrian connections to schools
- Sidewalk extensions
- Improved walking access within neighborhoods



SIDEWALK AND TRAIL MAINTENANCE



- Sidewalk and boardwalk repairs
- Improvements to conform with Americans with Disabilities Act guidelines



SAFETY AND TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT TECHNOLOGY



- Enhance network capability for travel time system
- Low emitting diode (LED) street lighting
- Embrace emerging technologies



NEIGHBORHOOD CONGESTION REDUCTION



- Traffic analysis to evaluate roadway improvements
- Roadway widening
- Improved channelization (restriping)
