PROCLAMATION

- Whereas:** The City of Bellevue recognizes the importance of honoring our past as we celebrate the future; and
- Whereas:** Bellevue incorporated on March 31, 1953 with a population of 5,940 across four square miles of land; and
- Whereas:** For thousands of years before, the area was inhabited by Salish Indians, followed by pioneer settlers who homesteaded along the eastern shores of Lake Washington in the 1860s; and
- Whereas:** Bellevue traces its roots to an agricultural past, attracting attention for its fertile berry fields and truck farming industry; and
- Whereas:** With the opening of the first Lake Washington floating bridge in 1940, farms gave way to residential neighborhoods and urban growth; and
- Whereas:** Through a program of strategic annexations, the city is now 31 square miles of land, stretching from Lake Washington to Lake Sammamish, with a population of more than 130,000; and
- Whereas:** With careful planning, the city has developed its downtown core into a major business, retail and residential center while retaining a small-town feel with thriving, woodsy neighborhoods; and
- Whereas:** Bellevue has grown into a regional employment center with more than 140,000 jobs, and is recognized for its excellent schools, beautiful parks and safe streets; and
- Whereas:** Bellevue is one of the state's most diverse cities, with minorities comprising 41 percent of Bellevue's population;
