I live on 105th Ave SE and cross is SE 16th. Our street is "no outlet" - since ST began, more people are racing through our neighborhoods, they have to wait to turn left on 104th Ave. so they sometimes turn left onto our street and barrel down it only to realize it dead ends, then they pull into our driveways and speed off back to 16th. Because we only have one way out via 16th, there is already trouble trying to turn left to go down towards the area of Chism Beach park. Also people are not yielding at the 16th and 104th cross so we have already seen plenty of near misses. You should make this a 4 way stop - temporarily during the program - in addition the school bus stops there and lots of people walk and have kids/dogs etc. we already feel like we are taking our lives in our hands with all the constant construction workers in the area and their big trucks rolling too fast on neighborhood streets. DO NOT make this a permanent solution, we are already nearly deaf from the pile driving and construction in Mercer Slough, in addition it is driving bewildered wildlife into our neighborhood where they are being hurt/run over and frightened- where is the plan for their protection? In addition It was stated that some informational material was sent to residents, I did not receive and neither did neighbors I spoke with. While I agree that traffic mitigation to keep commuters out of Enatai is necessary, there has to be a better way to help the people who actually live in Enatai. We need to be able to drive across Bellevue Way to get to/from schools. Some days I cross Bellevue Way at SE 16th 4-6 times between 4:00-7:00PM to drive from my house (16th and 100th) to the HS. Using Wolverine Way takes much longer. I like to CROSS Bellevue Way, not drive on it with all it's traffic for my short trips. Using Wolverine Way causes me to get caught in all the Bellevue Way traffic and triples my drive time to the HS.

My senior daughter has issues driving home from HS after soccer practice--she parks in S lot of HS. Gate to N lots is closed. She can only turn R on 108th from S lot, then is forced to turn N on Bellevue Way instead of going straight on SE 16th--we live just off SE 16th. She will now have to turn L onto SE 13th or SE 14th in order to get home (unprotected turn in a stick shift up a hill for a 17 year old)--is this really helping neighborhood traffic, by pushing us onto smaller residential streets?

I needed to drive to HS 3 separate times on both Thursday and Friday for my sophomore daughter (she plays JV soccer and is in Marching Band and I needed to get her get her dinner, etc. as she is at school for 13 hours those days this week, as well as getting to my sister's house (who lives on 108th). Using an alternate route to get home from school triples my drive time. I live close to the HS so have easy access and these restrictions are not helpful.

A family who lives just south of Bellevue Way on 108th--boys in Cross Country had 30 minutes to get home, shower, eat dinner, and get back to Marching Band at 6:00 and were unable to make it to band on time because of new traffic restrictions.

I bicycle commute from Seattle to downtown Bellevue a few times a week and bus other times. My preferred route is to follow 108th from the I-90 bike trail to the transit center for both morning (northbound) and evening (southbound) trips.

As a cyclist, I absolutely love the reduced traffic on 108th, it feels a lot safer and I've felt like I've had far fewer risky passes than I've seen in a while (vehicles passing my bike with either unsafe distance or ignoring the double yellow lines where passing is not permitted).

That said, in the evening, I see plenty of people ignore the southbound signs disallowing vehicles to proceed to the 108th/Bellevue way intersection next to the gas station. I'm not sure if there should be more enforcement, since there (anecdotally) seems to be a reduction in southbound traffic going to Bellevue way, but it's still happening frequently.

Similar comments about the intersection of Main St and 108th Southbound, which prevents cars from traveling straight south on 108th. Even with the clear signage, people still go straight south (from the right had turn lane) through the intersection when not permitted.

Dear City of Bellevue Council Members,

This is to make you aware that three of your city officials Karen L. Gonzalez, Marie Jensen and John Murphy have made an unfair and a biased decision to block path between Bellevue high school and homes of students by imposing unfair 4-7 PM turn restrictions on SE 16TH ST. These city officials are taking on a HUGE liability upon themselves, and the City of Bellevue, including all Bellevue Council members, by forcing several hundred new teenage drivers from safer local neighborhood streets onto riskier higher speed and high traffic street Bellevue Way. The 4-7 PM turn restrictions on SE 16TH ST will affect all current and future BHS students that use SE 16TH ST to drive to their homes after end of school. There are days when the BHS traffic doesn't even clear up till 4:15 PM or 4:20 PM and these restrictions are interfering with the ability of parents and students to safely reach home by use of internal neighborhood streets.

Who takes liability if there is a death or injury of a new teenage driver simply trying to come back from after a day in high school because the City decided to force the drivers to use streets with higher traffic? Please be aware that a purpose of this email is to make you aware that three of your city officials - Karen L. Gonzalez, Marie Jensen and John Murphy, are taking on a HUGE liability upon themselves and the City of Bellevue, including all Bellevue Council members, by forcing several hundred new teenage drivers from safer local neighborhood streets onto riskier higher speed and high traffic street Bellevue Way.

This email will be used in court as evidence that city officials were aware that they were forcing several hundred new teenage drivers from safer local neighborhood streets onto riskier higher speed and high traffic street Bellevue Way by enforcing turn restrictions on SE 16TH ST and knowingly took on liability for future death or injury of any BHS student driving back from school to their home on Bellevue Way because other ways were blocked by city officials.

Numerous residents of the impacted neighborhoods have notified your three city officials that these restrictions have been forced onto residents without proper analysis of risk to new teen drivers heading home after a day of school at BHS. These restrictions affect all residents that have elementary school or middle school students today that will be going to BHS in the future. As a consequence of these turn restrictions, the city is forcing new teen drivers to use busier Bellevue Way instead of internal residential streets that residents were previously able to use when coming back from high school to their homes.

As tax payers, we have access rights to public streets. 4-7 PM turn restrictions on SE 16TH ST are taking away 60 hours of access every month.

We have communicated that city's decision to impose turn restrictions on SE 16th is NOT a solution to ANY problem. It is simply creating a NEW PROBLEM for several hundred residents. It is blocking the path between high school and several hundred homes.

Why are City officials risking the lives of high school students returning to their homes by forcing them to use Bellevue Way that has high speed trucks and buses?

If this is not resolved gracefully with an acceptable solution for all residents, it will be escalated to the state transportation officials, the Washington Governor and US department of transportation that have over sight on city's unfair transportation decisions. Karen, Marie and John have indicated if enough residents raise a concern with turn restrictions on SE 16th, they will look into a possible solution.

We asked as to how many residents have expressed their concern and the officials refused to give that information.

City officials should not be creating a new problem for neighborhoods by attempting to solve a problem for other neighborhoods. The turn restrictions weren't there up until 30 days ago. Why can't city simply issue the local residents a pass or a sticker so the local residents using the direct path between high school and their homes are not impacted by the turn restrictions? The traffic from the high school doesn't even clear up on some days up until 4:15 or 4:20 pm.

Why can't the City do the following?

- 1. Issue a pass or a sticker to the local residents using the direct path between high school and their homes?
- 2. Change the restriction to 5-7 PM so at least high school traffic has enough time to leave before the restrictions kick in
- 3. Or simply allow all local residents full access to the streets that they had access to up until 30 days ago

Definitely the city officials have been influenced more by certain neighborhoods than others as creating a problem for neighborhoods while solving problem for another neighborhood shows lack of experience of decision makers.

It is sad to see that other advanced states like Texas are solving the transportation problems by enabling drivers with use of 85 mph toll roads and synchronized traffic lights for ~50 miles of driving across entire cities without stopping on traffic lights and our city officials are innovating restrictions to use of our own neighborhood streets by blocking path between high school and several hundred homes affected by the restrictions.
