REQUIREMENTS:

- ð Attend a local high school (public or private)
- ð High school age youth (up to age 21)
- ð Have participated in some form of leadership such as, but not limited to: a job, school clubs, sports, babysitting younger siblings, advocacy, community involvement, attended leadership conferences, etc.

OBLIGATIONS:

- ð Attend the Youth Link Board scheduled orientation, retreat, and training events
- ð Attend 2 meetings per month from September to June (on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday) at different locations throughout the City of Bellevue (includes community centers and high schools)
- ð Notify via phone or email at least 24 hours prior to an absence from a meeting, unless it is due to an emergency
- ð Participate as a representative or liaison to community organizations as needed
- ð Attend the Annual Youth Link Board Gumbo Night, from 5:00 7:00PM (in late February)
- ð Attend the Annual Community Leadership Awards Ceremony, from 6:00 8:00PM (in late May)
- ð Act as a representative of the Youth Link Board at public events and in the community as needed
