First Levy Project Begins Soon: This is one of the first projects where we will be putting your **Levy Tax Dollars** to work. By the second week of June, construction will start to repair broken and displaced sidewalk panels in the Crossroads area. If the work takes place in front of your business or home, a door hanger will be placed on your front door informing you when the work will happen. Additionally, *Neighborhood Levy Project* construction signs will be posted indicating the specific location of the sidewalk replacement work.



Construction Impacts & Schedule: Work hours will be 7 a.m. – 4 p.m., Monday – Friday, or possibly during a 10-hour shift, Monday - Thursday, depending on the location.

Because of the high number of sidewalk sections being replaced (360 total), this work will continue through March 2018.

For bicyclists, drivers and pedestrians, please be cautious when you are in the construction zone. At times, lane and sidewalk closures will be needed for the safety of both the work crew and the public.


