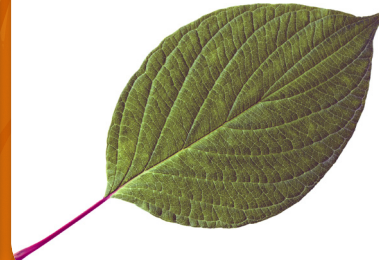

MOSTLY FROM OTHER TREES LIKE DOUGLAS-FIR,
WESTERN HEMLOCK, WESTERN RED-CEDAR, AND
RED ALDER. CONES
ARE FULL OF SEEDS
THAT ARE A
FAVORITE SNACK
FOR SQUIRRELS.
