



# NEW SIDEWALKS AND TRAILS

The Neighborhood Sidewalk Program started in 2007 to help address the sidewalk needs and priorities of the city's many neighborhoods. The program budget is currently \$1million per year. Candidate projects go through a prioritization process with the Transportation Commission and are evaluated based on criteria such as number of vehicles that use the street, safety, connections to activity centers, and collisions. Projects typically cost between \$500,000 and \$2million.

There is a backlog of over 30 high-priority neighborhood sidewalk projects, as identified by community members. At current funding levels, it could take over 30 years to complete our candidate list, with no added projects.
